CHANGING ACTIVITIES

The curriculum is a framework not a blueprint.

MANAGING CHALLENGING BEHAVIOUR

The vast majority of All Stars and Dynamos sessions are run without any issues but at times kids can become upset or display challenging behaviour that could affect the fun or safety within the activity.

- Set, and be consistent with rules and boundaries
- Remain calm and non-confrontational
- Allow kids time and space to calm down if upset
- Always praise positive behaviour and although negatives should be flagged, do not dwell on them
- Engage parents if things become too challenging

MANAGING GROUPS

Things to consider in your delivery

- 5-11 year olds, like most of us, switch off if given too much information. Give short and sharp explanations at the beginning of activities and keep the energy high.
- Ask parents and guardians to help. If given clear roles and information we find most people will willingly get involved.
- Use cones, ropes or All Stars & Dynamos pop-up banners to designate clear areas to run activities in. It's difficult to control a group spread all over the field. Ensure children understand where they are allowed to go/where not to.
- Allow additional space for Dynamos Countdown Cricket away from All Stars sessions (where possible).
- Always have in your mind how games/activities can be scaffolded for different abilities. Use STEP Approach
- Try not to over coach technique and try not to stop the group repeatedly and interupt the flow of an activity. Giving kids lots of goes will allow them to often work it out themselves.
- If the group are really struggling to concentrate with an activity and you've tried everything else, don't be afraid to send your group for a drink and bring them back in with another activity. The curriculum is just a basis to work from, if your group aren't enjoying an activity, change it!

FOR THOSE PROGRAMMES IN CLUBS, THERE ARE A FEW KEY THINGS YOU CAN DO TO HELP PROGRESS YOUR ALL STARS INTO YOUR JUNIOR CRICKET SECTIONS OR THE NEXT STEP OF THEIR CRICKETING LIFE.

- Progression through our National Programmes, from All Stars into Dynamos Cricket and beyond, should always be based on the needs of the child in terms of their age but also the level of their emotional and physical development. We find that most children are ready to move on to the next level after 2 years in each of our National Programmes but those younger, or less developed, participants may need longer.
- Offering a clear, and well explained, pathway in your club, from All Stars Cricket into Dynamos Cricket or your Under 9s, will help kids to progress to the next appropriate stage.
- For children wanting to play club cricket throughout the summer, there are over 5,000 clubs around the country for you to choose from. Dynamos Cricket is ideal for those who have graduated from All Stars Cricket but is also perfect for those who are brand new to the game meaning Dynamos Cricket and The Hundred are perfect partners. Both are designed to open up Cricket, make it more accessible to families and inspire the next generation to feel that Cricket is a game for them.

Kids that sign up for Dynamos will receive priority access tickets for their family, as well as 3 Topps Cricket Attax cards at each session and money-can't-buy experiences associated with the competition and its partners. Activators will also have exclusive access to a prize draw to win free tickets to live games in The Hundred.


All activators running Dynamos Cricket should have the app on their phone and can be downloaded at the App Store for iPhones and the Google Play store for Android phones.




ECB ACTIVATOR APP
