Senior Match Reports

Sat 4th June: 1st XI win @ Didcot 1st XI

Despite getting lost on the way to the ground, forgetting the warm up gear and not partaking in the warm-up, captain Moore won yet another toss and elected to field on what certainly looked like a bowler friendly pitch.

Didcot got off to a solid start, reaching 25-0, before an over of madness from Matt Bolton produced 3 wickets for no runs. First he nicked off one of the Didcot openers, then a mix up between the two batsman saw number 3 run out for 0, and finally he bowled the next man in first ball. Two more quick wickets followed to leave Didcot reeling at 48-5. An impressive sixth wicket partnership looked like getting the hosts back into the game but a wicket each for Reckers and Tom saw Bledlow back on top with the score 110-7. Didcot's tail got them up to 160 before being bowled out.

Tom and Olly went out to bat with 10 overs play left before tea and were 30-0 when tea was taken. After tea Olly attempted to come back for an over ambitious second run and was narrowly adjudged run out blaming one too many slices of pizza. The score was 60 when Tom was out caught and bowled which started a tough spell for the batsmen as Will and Harry struggled to score against a good combination of spin and seam bowling from Didcot. Will was dismissed for 0, kicking off the nerves in the Bledlow dressing room. Bledlow then lost a further 3 wickets for 40 runs to leave a tricky 50 runs to win with just 4 wickets remaining. However, a counter attacking partnership of 52 between Marcus and Hawkesy saw Bledlow home with 13 overs left.

Sat 11th June: 1st XI lose @ Great Brickhill 2rd XI The skipper Tom lost the toss but got his way as Brickhill elected to bat first on a green pitch. Things got off to a great start with the Pearces tying down the opening batsmen. This first led to a run out created by Matt Bolton, and then three quick wickets for Dave, leaving the home side struggling at 35-4. Brickhill's batsmen then dug in, a torturously slow 5th wicket partnership of 43 restored some hope to their innings. However, the change bowlers of Matt Bolton and James Hawkes continued to chip away to leave Bledlow needing 148.

The opening partnership didn't last long with Olly adjudged LBW for 4. Harry Bartlett came in and put on a quick 43 run partnership with Tom before falling for 19. Bledlow then struggled to 85-5 before a good stand between Charlie Downes and Sam Mudie looked to have us on course for victory. They were both dismissed with the score on 123, leaving 25 runs left to win. Another quick wicket meant the game was slipping away until the Pearces came together and managed to take the team to within 4 runs of victory before Matt was bowled. This brought new man Don Woodward to the crease. With just 2 runs to win, Dave hit the ball to point on the fifth ball of the over and set off for the single that would level the scores, however a direct hit resulted in Don being run out and Bledlow losing the match by a single run.

Both openers fell relatively cheaply and wicket followed quickly to leave Bledlow 45-3. A series of poor shots followed leading to Bledlow losing 4 wickets for just 4 runs. 'veterans' were called out of voluntary retirement to make up the numbers on Saturday, as the bulk of the 1 st XI were stagging their way around Great Yarmouth. Early nerves and tensions were extinguished when Rob Fitzgerald was told to sit down and be quiet, well before the start, and the warm up consisted of Andie Witney 'nipping' home for a jumper. Bowling first, Bledlow made runs hard to come by and the Chairman received his first ever official warning for dangerous bowling when he landed a full toss on the opener's leg stump, only to see it called no ball. Apparently the considered opinion of both umpires was that this was the act of an aggressive opening bowler. The batsman went on to make 52 before the Chairman dismissed him for a second time! Ben Moore and the express bowling of regular keeper Bartlett accounted for the majority of the wickets, reducing the visitors to 178 all out.
